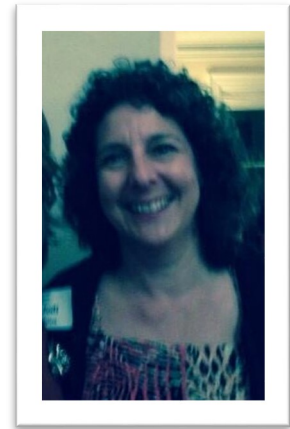
Welcome To My Happy Place!

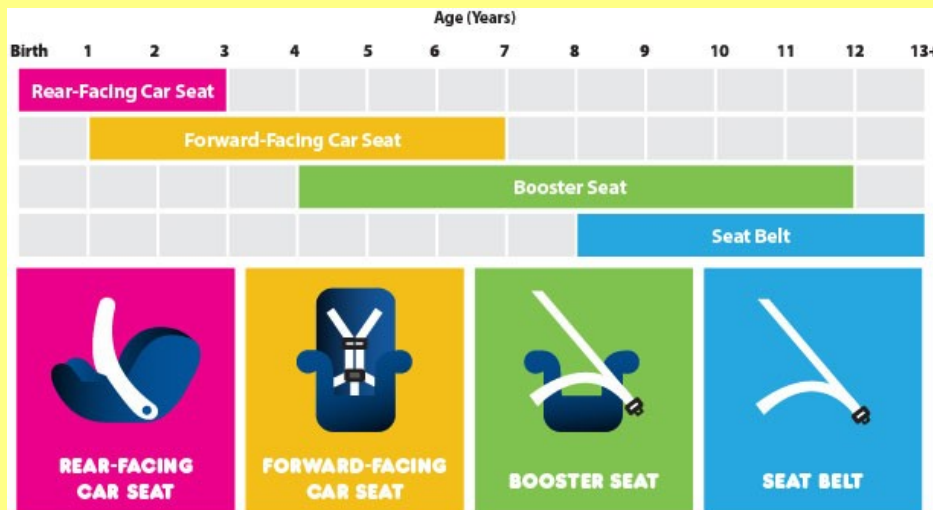
